Read the article below. There are two tasks to do after you read.

PUBLIC PAYPHONES WITH PRESS BUTTON DIALLING

COIN OPERATED PAYPHONES – They have usually displays which tell you what coins they take. Lift the handset, listen for a dial tone, and check that the display shows 'insert money' and that the return chute flap is hanging free in the vertical position. Insert coins until the credit indicator stops flashing. Key number and wait for a connection. Insert further coins as necessary; the credit indicator will display the total credit remaining. Wholly unused coins will be returned at the end of the call, but no change will be given for partially used coins. To make a second call using unused credit do not hang up, but press the continuation button on the handset hook to regain a dial tone.

PHONECARD PHONES – To use these phones, you must first buy one of the special cards which are available in various values from post offices and shops displaying the 'Phonecard' sign. You may then make any number of calls up to the value of the card, whenever you wish, without the need for cash, but only from special, Phonecard phones. Your card will be returned, with the credit deducted as appropriate, at the end of the call.
