TAKE-AWAY PIZZAS

We set out to test pizza firms around the country for the quality of their pizzas and their home delivery services. Our panel consisted of MADDALENA, a restaurant chef; the SPOONER family – Eva, Stephen and their daughters Joanna, 9 and Katie 7; and a student MICHELLE.

A – PIZZA PLUS

Maddalena felt that her double-decker, double cheese pepperoni pizza she ordered was "salty and greasy". The amount of grease on the box exceeded that of all the other pizzas she tried.

Family-oriented marketing clearly works, as the film proved the overall winner with the Spooner children. They agreed with their parents that the Margharita with pepperoni pizza they had was "salty and greasy", but insisted, with typical childish logic, that they liked Pizza Plus best "because they give you toothpaste and shower gel and they let you eat as much ice cream as you like" – even though the gifts aren't available with take-aways. The branch closest to the Spooners took 27 minutes to deliver the pizza, but it arrived hot and the Spooners found the telephone reception "friendly and helpful".

Michelle judged her choice of pizza – with ham and pineapple topping – the best value and flavour of all. It was, she said, "filling and tasty, with just the right proportion of topping to base."

B-PIZZA PARADISE

A "Mega Week" promotion at Pizza Paradise outlets meant that Maddalena was able to buy an enormous extra-large pizza with her own choice of pineapple, tuna and olives topping at a reduced price. She judged it "virtually tasteless; the only distinguishable flavour is that of the strongest ingredient – in this case, pineapple."

The Spooners had their cheese, tomato and bacon pizza rushed around in 17 minutes. They found it "slightly tasteless but very fresh", and though the base was tough, at least it wasn't greasy. The children thought it was better than most because it had "more topping."

Michelle complained that her mixed grill pizza was delivered lukewarm after 40 minutes because they had taken down her address wrongly, and she couldn't spot any mushrooms.

C – THE PIZZA FACTORY

Maddalena thought the coloured peppers on her small, mixed pizza made it look "quite jolly". The base was fine in texture but she pointed out that the meat had an unappetising appearance, although it tasted fine.

The Spooners thought their cheese, tomato and mushroom pizza had a good base, "which was just as well, as there wasn't much else to it. The topping was tasteless and we had no inclination to finish it."

Michelle went back to her pineapple and ham theme by ordering the Tropicale, but it didn't have much flavour. "It wasn't greasy, but the pineapple tasted odd."
