

LISTENING TAPESCRIPT

(Please read twice.)

Nicky: Next, we're going over live to team news reporter, Jake, who's got some breaking news. Where are you, Jake?

Jake: Thank you, Mrs Collins. Over here is one of the school's pupils. Darren, you're 16, you're in Year 11 and you've got your exams this week. How do you feel about this?

Darren: It's scary. But I'm not at the school at the moment anyway. I'm on study leave.

Jake: Any thoughts about why this happened?

Darren: Well, no, not really. It could be anything! It could be a problem with the electrics, someone smoking. Or someone who doesn't like exams! Who knows?

Jake: Thanks, Darren. Back to the studio.

Nicky: Thanks, Jake. Well, sadly school fires are becoming a problem in Britain. Some new Government figures were released yesterday.

James: Yes, the police and fire services were called to 3,000 arson attacks in British schools in the last two years.

Nicky: Three thousand? Well, this is a serious issue – you can hear more about it in this month's Special Report.
