While discussing, follow these points:

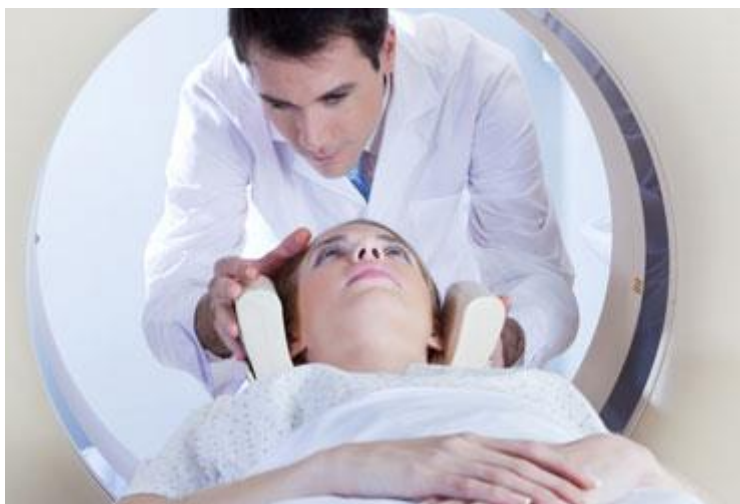

Text A

During Wimbledon I asked one tennis player to read the Maya Angelou poem *And Still I Rise*. She asked me if it sounded all right. I said, 'No, you can do the second part much better, with more conviction. Try it again.' She did and it was brilliant, but my team couldn't believe I'd said that. I find it annoying when people don't say what they mean. Feedback is good.

Text B

I've long been aware of the body image issues that young girls face, so I wanted to include a positive message in my children's novel. I hope that this book will in some way help a generation of girls grow up not worrying what they look like, for them to realise the strength they can get from their heads and their bodies, plus a sense of team spirit – the idea that it's better to come together and help each other out.

Text C

It's set in the world of racing, which I know, and the smart yard is based on how I remember my father's, but the main characters are more like my nieces and nephews. Fiora is five and Charlie is modelled on her – strong and independent with a can-do attitude. Fiora's too young to read at the moment, although she can ride! My two nephews read the book and said, 'Auntie Clare, Harry and Larry are us!'

Text D

I have come across racehorses that won't gallop. My dad trained a very good sprinter called Locksom. She wouldn't go anywhere without Dad beside her on a horse called Quirk, who I used to ride as a child. Champion jockey Kieren Fallon, who's just retired, told me he learnt to ride on a cow. It might not be true but I liked the idea, so I included it in the book. I know a lot of people who call their chickens after celebrities, too.

Text E

Children feel insecure, particularly little girls, about how they fit into this world. My mum was teased at school in the same way Charlie is. Children would moo at her or call her a cow. I didn't know that when I wrote it, which is strange. Maybe I picked it up subconsciously. Recalling the experience really moved her.
