LISTENING COMPREHENSION

For all fans of *Harry Potter* and *Alice in Wonderland*, this is the 2-hour specialist tour to take. Every Friday or Saturday, enter the magical worlds of *Harry Potter* and *Alice in Wonderland* and visit Christ Church College, New College and the Divinity School with professionally trained blue and green guides.

Christ Church, with its beautiful meadows, is also the college associated with the hugely popular *Alice in Wonderland* books.

You'll be shown how these film sites were adapted to create the backdrop for the scenes in the *Harry Potter* films, and which parts of the university were used as inspiration for the Grand Hall at Hogwarts. You'll learn more about the real little girl upon whom Alice was based, along with her real pet cat, and hear what her life was like, as well as why the books became so hugely popular.

Your guide will be an enthusiastic expert on Harry and Alice and be able to answer your questions. They will be trained in the history of the city and university too, and so can take questions on background information as well.

Tickets are limited to 19 to ensure that you have a pleasant experience and can ask your guide questions as you walk around with them.

Your tour will cover 2 miles of walking, with three building visits, and so it covers more ground than other tours. It stops every so often to see the film sites.

The city centre is quite flat and walkable – however, please note that some of the ancient colleges included on this tour do have unavoidable steps.
