**Solution A**

Don't worry, it can be reheated in the microwave (but not too long or it will dry out).

**Solution B**

Freeze leftover cuts as soon as possible with a little gravy or stock to keep them moist.

**Solution C**

Once thawed, it can be kept for up to two days in the fridge. Place in a roasting tin, cover loosely with Clingfilm and store below 4° C.

**Solution D**

Give them a light brush to remove debris and scent with a fragranced oil – orange and cloves is a favourite.

**Solution E**

Cook sausages and stuffing balls after the turkey has come out. If you let the turkey 'rest', it makes it easier to carve.

**Solution F**

Use a side plate instead of a full-sized one, as it will trick the brain into thinking you've eaten more.

**Solution G**

Put some ice in a bucket, pop the bottles in and pour in some cold water.

**Solution H**

Only open the oven when really necessary to avoid the temperature dropping. You can also brown spuds under the grill for a few minutes.

**Solution I**

If you've simmered it for too long, it can go runny again unless thickened with cornflour. Add more cornflour and simmer for a few more minutes.

**Solution J**

It can stay warm for quite a while. Remove the vegetables from the heat, drain and set aside, then boil or microwave them for a couple of minutes when your guests arrive.

**Solution K**

Puree them with any leftover gravy or some vegetable stock to make a thick, hearty soup.

**Solution L**

Cut the legs off, then cook the breast as a crown. Cook the drumsticks separately once the crown is ready.
