## The country of lakes

Minnesota is known as 'the land of 10,000 lakes'. At least a thousand of these lakes are
situated in the Superior National Forest, on the boundary between Canada and the USA. This area
is called the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness. Here, there are more than one million acres
of lakes, rivers and forests. Many of the lakes are connected, (1)
More than 200,000 visitors come to this remote region to camp, hike, boat and canoe each

were unhappy. Miners and loggers had lost their jobs. Hotel and restaurant owners had fewer
customers. They thought that everyone should be able to visit the Boundary Waters -

Many environmentalists oppose the law. They think that these motor vehicles pollute the
clean air and create noise to scare wildlife. This means that the Boundary Waters are no longer
truly a "wilderness".
